Sunderland v Chelsea 07/05/16

Chelsea scored first through pantomime villain Diego Costa and Khazri equalised with a wonderful volley. However, a simple goal from Nemanja Matic sent the Pensioners in a goal ahead.

With Newcastle drawing at already relegated Aston Villa, we certainly needed a point but took all three when Fabio Borini and then Jermain Defoe scored within three minutes of each other to send the crowd of 47,050 into raptures.



Both goals were special and the day got better when John Terry was sent off for two

yellow cards and Newcastle failed to beat an already relegated Villa.
